

The University of Texas at El Paso Department of Social Work Assistant Professor (Tenure-Track) Position Announcement

The University of Texas at El Paso (UTEP) Department of Social Work in the College of Health Sciences invites applications for a full-time tenure-track Assistant Professor. This is a 9-month appointment with potential for summer teaching. Job responsibilities include demonstrating excellence in teaching and mentoring at the undergraduate and graduate level, establishing a strong research agenda, and service to the department, college, university, and profession. Anticipated appointment date is Fall 2023.

The University of Texas at El Paso is on the U.S.-Mexico border with Juárez as its sister city. This bi-national and bi-cultural community gives our students a unique perspective on social work. The Department of Social Work is committed to educating culturally competent practitioners who are able to serve the border region and beyond.

The UTEP Department of Social Work offers both a **Bachelor of Social Work (BSW)** that prepares students for generalist practice and a **Master of Social Work (MSW)** that prepares students for advanced practice with a concentration in Social Work in the Border Region. A **Doctorate in Social Work (DSW)** is in development.

This position represents an excellent opportunity for an outstanding individual to build on a record and program of research and/or external funding commensurate with rank at the time of appointment. The applicant should demonstrate a commitment to social justice and diversity, equity, inclusion, and accessibility in social work practice, education, and research with a record of or potential for a strong research agenda focusing on mental health/behavioral health area and community-based research. Being that the Department is part of the College of Health Sciences, there is also an emphasis on addressing health inequalities as they relate to the border region. Tenured/Tenure Track faculty members of the Department participate with the college's Ph.D. in Interdisciplinary Health Sciences.

Required Qualifications

- 1) An earned doctorate in social work or a closely related discipline (ABD will be considered if graduation is anticipated by June 2023);
- 2) An MSW from a CSWE-accredited program;
- 3) A minimum of three years of post-MSW experience as a practicing social worker;
- 4) A record of active scholarship focusing on mental/behavioral health as evidenced by publications, conference presentations, research funding, and/or other scholarly activities;
- 5) Potential for securing external research funding;
- 6) Experience in teaching and/or mentoring undergraduate or graduate students;

- 7) Background and experience that promotes social justice, diversity, and student access/success;
- 8) Licensure or eligibility for licensure as an LMSW or LCSW; and
- 9) The ability to work effectively with faculty, staff, students, and community stakeholders from diverse ethnic, cultural, and socioeconomic backgrounds.

Preferred Qualifications

- 1) Experience in a Hispanic Serving Institution
- 2) Knowledge of and experience with CSWE accreditation guidelines
- 3) Bilingualism in English and Spanish
- 4) A record of service in graduate and doctoral education
- 5) An understanding of and commitment to community and globally engaged scholarship

Department of Social Work

The department has been educating social workers for over four decades and founded the accredited MSW degree in 2008 - the only such degree in the country with a concentration on Social Work in the Border Region. The student body is highly diverse, comprises a Hispanic, bilingual majority, and includes a significant number of first-generation and international students.

The highly diverse departmental faculty is active in research programs in behavioral health, child welfare, migrants and refugees, intimate partner violence, aging, and health disparities. In addition to active research programs and scholarly engagement with the community, social work faculty participate as chairs and members on Ph.D. in Interdisciplinary Health Sciences committees and direct doctoral dissertations.

Set against the backdrop of the Franklin Mountains in the Chihuahuan Desert, UTEP's awardwinning, sustainably designed campus landscape and unique Bhutanese architecture create an energizing and tranquil oasis in the bustling El Paso-Juárez metroplex of more than 2 million residents. Application Instructions

Applicants must submit the following information:

- 1) Letter of application describing their interest in the position and experiences in social work (or closely related discipline) practice, education, and research highlighting how their credentials and experiences align with required qualifications and any applicable preferred qualifications;
- 2) Curriculum vitae;
- 3) Abbreviated research philosophy and plan (2 pages or less);
- 4) Brief teaching philosophy (2 pages or less);
- Statement describing how candidate currently promotes diversity, equity, inclusion, and accessibility (DEIA) through their teaching, scholarship/research, and service, and how candidate would continue or begin to implement DEIA-relevant practices at UTEP and SW (2 pages or less);
- 6) A sample of research publications or scholarship productivity; and
- 7) Names and contact information of three references (references will not be contacted until an applicant has been selected for an on-campus visit).

Review of applications will begin immediately. Preliminary interviews will be conducted by video conference call fall semester 2022 with on-campus finalist visits to follow. The position will remain open until filled. The successful applicant will commence duties mid-August 2023.
