Minimum Qualifications:

The minimum education requirement for appointment to this position is a MSW and a terminal degree in Social Work or related area. Candidates nearing completion of the terminal degree may be considered; however, all requirements for conferral of the degree must be met no later than the start date of the position. Candidates must also have practice and/or teaching experience in behavioral health such as mental health and substance use prevention and treatment at the micro, messo, and/or macro level. In addition, we are looking for teaching experience across the curriculum, human behavior in the social environment, and substance use; ability to utilize educational technology both online and in the classroom; interpersonal skills that facilitate communication and connection with diverse communities and disciplines.

The School of Social Work places a high priority on recruiting new students, faculty and staff who represent historically under-served communities and socio-demographic diversity including Latinx/ae, Hmong, Indigenous, Native American, and rural North State learners and residents.

Responsibilities:
