BHWET-Para Behavioral Health Workforce Education and Training – Paraprofessionals	 Develop and expand community-based experiential training Increase the supply of students preparing to become peer support specialists and other behavioral health-related paraprofessionals Special focus: Children, adolescents, and transition-aged youth in high need and high demand areas at risk for behavioral health disorders
GPE Graduate Psychology Education- Program	• Train doctoral health psychology students, interns, and post- doctoral residents to provide integrated, interdisciplinary, behavioral health and OUD and other SUD prevention and treatment services in high need and high demand areas.
