ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- Instructors must be full-time graduate school faculty at a U.S. college/university.
- Instructors must be teaching in a Master's &/or Doctoral program in counseling, marriage & family therapy, psychology, or social work.
- Instructors must integrate a standardized, online program in spiritual competency training into a required, clinically related course in Spring 2023.
- Instructors must assist with the evaluation of the spiritual competency training program.
- The graduate program has not offered course work related to religion & spirituality in mental health in the past two years.
